

They have all given dedicated and practical support to the Trust and Chris Houlbrooke's commitment has stretched across many decades – thank you to them all. When we have a new vicar in post, he/she will be invited to join the Trust and help cement the link between Church and School. For our founder, these two elements were inseparable.


The Church Hall remains available to use in these challenging Covid 19 times but with strict rules applying to ensure the safety of all. The Trust and the generosity of Thomas Moulson still benefits our local community through the provision of the Church/Village Hall in Hargrave, the adjoining field where the Happy Days weekend is held in June and the Old School House which provides an income through being rented out. Sir Thomas Moulson left an endowment to the parish in his will and the investments arising from this allow an annual distribution of funds – one third to defray the cost of expenses incurred by the vicar, one third to help maintain St Peter's Church and one third to give to young applicants to help in paying for their education and associated expenses.

Finally, we must thank Diana Deakin for acting in recent years as bookings secretary for the Hall. Dear reader – is this something you could help out with now? Every day is filled with learning and fun. One lunchtime, we even designed ourselves a workstation - with chairs - made out of the wooden blocks so that we could play our made up games.








## Facebook & Website update



## My Colleague Wykes by Ol' Buzz

In October 2017, this feature described Wykes being photographed, puffing on his morning cigar, right underneath a big NO SMOKING sign on a petrol station. This time, this resident of "Godawfulming" as he always called it, dealt the conversation stopper.
